

Create an Opera in a Day

Students take on the role of musicians, designers, authors and performers as they learn about Britten and one of his best loved operas and develop and perform one of their own.

Links: History KS1 & KS2, Music KS1 & KS2, English, Art & Design

Murder in the Orchestra

Students become history detectives for the day as they use their literacy, historical, problem solving and exploration skills to crack a special case.

Links: History KS1 & KS2, Music KS1 & KS2, Mathematics, Art & Design

Musical Minibeasts

Students will hunt for minibeasts in the beautiful garden, explore Britten's Studio and Library and compose their own piece of music inspired by the nature they have discovered.

Links: Science KS1 & KS2, History KS1 & KS2, Music KS1 & KS2, English.

The Science of Sound

This exciting, practical session explores the science behind sound and music, with students completing numerous experiments and demonstrations throughout the day.

Links: Science KS1 & KS2, Music KS1 & KS2

Britten's Childhood

Students will handle and examine artefacts and toys from when Britten was a child, explore poetry that inspired him, and will then work together to develop their own performance.

Links: History KS1 & KS2, Music KS1 & KS2, English KS1 & KS2

Midsummer Music Mystery

While exploring The Red House, students will help solve a mystery by finding clues, handling items from the collections and writing music.

Links: History KS1 & KS2, Music KS1 & KS2, English

Music Through Time (Three sessions available)

1. Anglo-Saxon & Viking: This unique day will explore the importance of music, art and storytelling at this time and how music as used to unite, inspire and communicate.

2. The Stone Age: This daylong session will offer the chance to handle genuine Stone Age artefacts, learn about Stone Age Life and explore how music was made.

3. Romans:

Explore what life was like in Roman Britain and how music was such an important part of Roman society.

Snape's Victorian Past

Students will explore this beautiful site and discover it's fascinating history through exploring primary and secondary evidence to learn about how music was brought to Snape Maltings, remember the people who worked at The Maltings in the past and to create their own music.

Fire

In 1969 a ferocious fire destroyed Britten's concert hall at Snape Maltings. The class will explore archive evidence and be tasked to plan and design its replacement.

Monday 07 – Saturday 12 March 2022

Celebration is our annual festival for schools and young people's community music groups across Suffolk.

Bring the imagination and creativity of the young people you work with and take centre-stage to perform on one of our Celebration dates, in the world-famous Snape Maltings Concert Hall.

Groups are selected for each evening's programme to include children of all ages and stages of learning. All genres, styles, and traditions of music are welcome, including your own compositions. As well as your own performance, all groups join together to perform a finale piece as part of a massed choir. The project also includes preperformance opportunities for young people and CPD sessions for teachers.

Jina and the STEM Sisters

Join lost budding scientist Jina on her adventure home, empowered by some of history's super-STEM women. Digital-coder Ada Lovelace, glamorous inventor Hedy Lamarr, 'radiating' Marie Curie and pioneering astronaut Mae Jemison are amongst those offering Jina scientific gifts of curiosity, courage, creativity, persistence and openmindedness, to help her find her way and follow her dreams to become a scientist!

This new multi-media musical puppet show for children is based on the discoveries and stories of historical STEM women who fought against the odds to pursue their flair for scientific enquiry but were often unacknowledged for their discoveries and frequently encountered discrimination and prejudice along the way.

Performances are supported by interactive science workshops on the day: exploring the world of palaeontologist Mary Anning or discovering x-raying materials and crystallography, alongside a bank of online cross-curricular teaching resources in the Online Education Zone.

Friday Afternoons


